## REASONS TO KEEP YOUR DOG ON A LEASH

It has been brought to our attention that some residents are walking their dogs through the common areas without a leash.

- It's the law It's a misdemeanor to have your dog off a leash, unless in a leash-free zone (gated dog park, etc.).
- Just because your dog is friendly, doesn't mean every dog is friendly, and it doesn't provide a reason for it to be of a leash.
- Many people of all ages are afraid of dogs, and can find it intrusive when approached by a dog off its leash.
- > Not everyone is physically able to withstand a dog jumping on them, even a nice dog.
- > People have a right to walk in public without being confronted by dogs off their leash.
- The Association's Governing Documents, CC&R's, Article 2, Section 2.6 states: When outside an enclosed yard area, animals must be kept under the control of a Person capable of controlling the animal either on a leash or other appropriate restraint.

### LANDSCAPE UPDATE

For the week of 11/7/2016 - 11/11/2016

Good Afternoon from your HOA Landscapers: We hope you have had a wonderful week. Below are some highlights of items scheduled, items completed, and plans for the next week.

#### Welcome November and the Holiday Season!

As we close out October and move into the Holiday season we will begin to see plants move into a more dormant state. It is also time of the year to cut back all ornamental grasses and Moreas plants. You will begin to see the crews cutting grasses down low to the ground. This process will push new growth and open the center to allow light in and rejuvenate the plant. The areas of high focus will be Camino Del Sur, parks, and street parkways.




High Winds: This week we have seen high warm winds push through Del Sur. Leaf debris will be a focus of the teams.



Aeration of Turf: Throughout the next few weeks we will be aerating several turf areas. Core aeration is essential for a healthier lawn through these means:

- Improved air exchange between the soil and atmosphere.
- Enhanced soil water uptake.
- Improved fertilizer uptake and use.
- Reduced water runoff and puddling.
- Stronger turf grass roots.
- Reduced soil compaction.



### How does your garden grow?

For the Garden lovers out there here are some tips on what you should be looking to accomplish in your Garden for November.

- Continue to plant winter vegetables to extend harvest time.
- Fertilize the plants set out in September.
- Keep beds moist to ensure good germination.
- Pull weeds as they appear.
- Pick off insects and snails.

## What to do in your yard for November:

There's always something to be doing in the front or backyard, whether it's pruning, tidying or sowing, so we've put together our top gardening tasks for November

- Plant rhubarb, asparagus and Garlic Crowns.
- Plant out any barefoot berries
- This month is an ideal time to move trees and shrubs, and plant hedges.
- Hardwood cuttings can be taken now from deciduous shrubs.
- Prune climbing roses and rambling roses once they've finished flowering and tie in the stems before autumn winds cause damage.
- Now is the time to plant bare root roses.

### **Irrigation**

- We are currently over seeding the Community Parkway grass areas. You will see the water on more frequently, however, we are putting down the same amount of water. This water is being spread out over several applications. You will see water come on in areas during the day and more frequently.
- The City of San Diego offers free Residential Water Surveys to help you identify ways to reduce your water consumption. Visit the Water Survey Programs page for more details.
