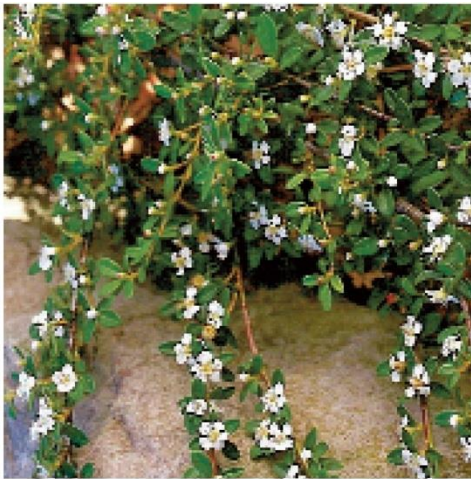

Moreover, these species will be periodically eradicated when found in substantial quantity in any area of the project. This prohibited list is for residential lots only. 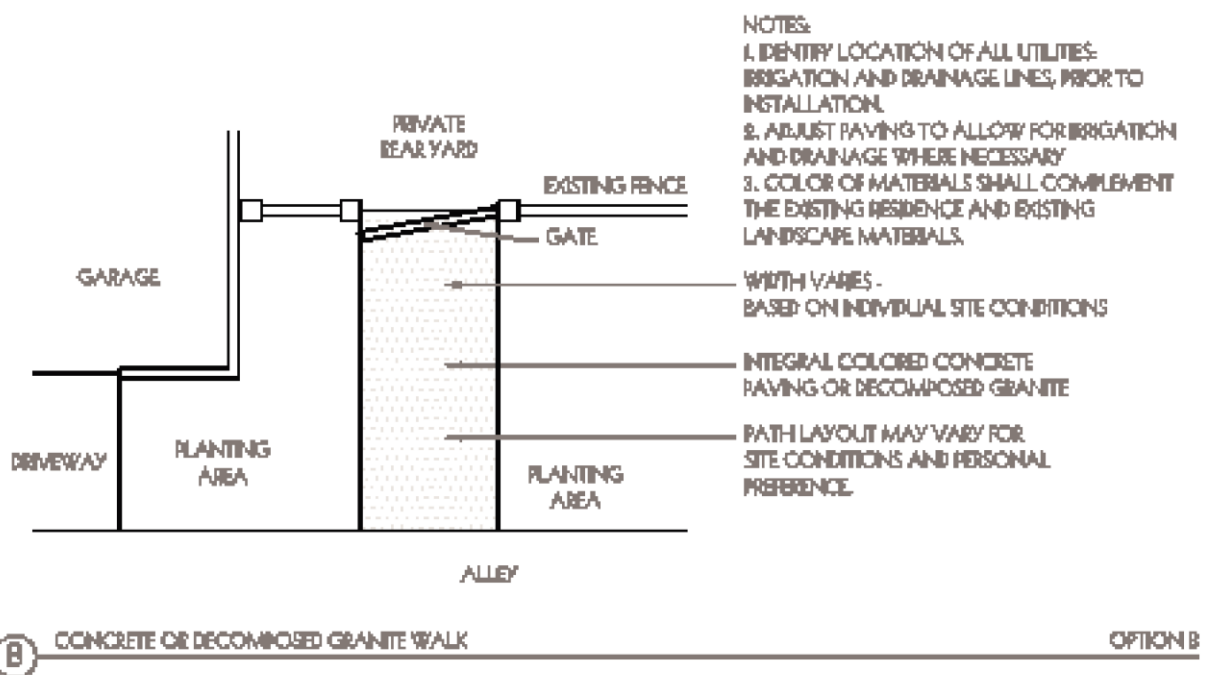
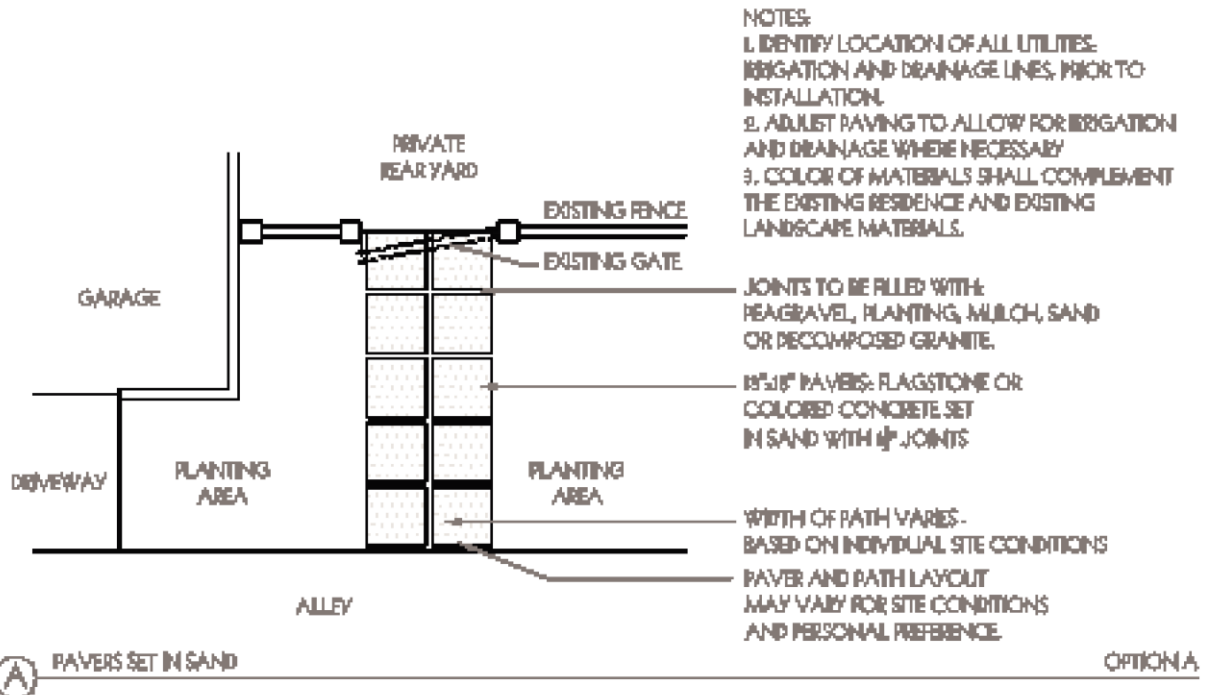
